MORNING PLENARY SESSION

'Surgery of conjoined twins'

On the 16th November 2009 at The Royal Children's Hospital (RCH) Melbourne, surgery to separate Bangladeshi conjoined twins Trishna and Krishna commenced after a lengthy period of planning.

Almost three years old, the twins were joined at the head and were first brought to the RCH by Moira Kelly's Children First Foundation (CFF) in 2007 where they were assessed and a decision was made to attempt separation. Since then RCH neurosurgeon Wirginia Maixner and her team performed several delicate life threatening procedures to redirect shared blood flow.

During this time the plastic and maxillofacial team led by surgeon Andrew Greensmith inserted tissue expanders to create the new tissue required for the separation procedure. The first tissue expanders were removed in January 2009 due to a serious infection and subsequent ones were reinserted in August 2009.

During all these procedures, the anaesthesia team provided crucial care for the twins, caring for two children having major surgery at the same time whilst dealing with the complex life threatening stresses that the twins' unique and changing cross circulation created.

At least 20 other departments at the RCH came in contact with the girls over the past two years.

For the final separation procedure, a team of 16, comprising neuro and plastic surgeons, anaesthetists, perioperative nurses and technicians participated in the complex and extremely high risk surgery.

Today, two of these perioperative nurses will share with you their experiences in working with the team to achieve the successful separation. They will outline the planning required and the subsequent surgery.


